2) Stream of consciousness novel

The phrase 'stream of consciousness' means the flow of thoughts in the minds of the characters. This phrase was coined by William James in his treatise, 'Principles of psychology' (1890).

The word 'Novella' which means new is originated from the Italian word 'Novelle'. A Novella is a type of prose fiction which is shorter than a full length novel & longer than short stories.
